Welcome to St Mungo Museum of Religious Life and Art. This awardwinning museum explores the importance of religion in people's lives across the world and across time.

At St Mungo's you can find out about some of the world's major religions including Buddhism, Christianity, Hinduism, Islam, Judaism, Sikhism and Chinese beliefs, and see stunning works of religious art including the awesome figure of the Hindu god Shiva. The museum is laid out over a number of floors so be sure to visit all the displays. And don't miss the 'mustsee' objects highlighted on this floor plan.







At St Mungo's there is always something to do, with a programme of events including thought-provoking workshops and talks. There is also a regular programme of temporary exhibitions. For details, visit the Enquiry Desk on the first floor or ask one of the staff.

Don't forget to visit the Zen garden, the museum shop or the popular café. You may also want to visit Provand's Lordship across the road, or the nearby Cathedral and Necropolis.
